



How to tell the age of a tree

- 1 : Everyone hold hands around the trunk of the tree.
- 2 : Now form a straight line holding hands.
- 3 : Ask an adult to measure the length of the line, by putting one foot in front of the other.
- 4 : Each step is approximately is 30cms. The length of the formed line is the same as the circumference of the tree trunk.
- 5: Each step = 12 years growth of the life of the tree




