
A coat of arms contains symbols and figures that represent your family

#### Here are some examples of Coats of Arms of the Viceroys\* that worked at Dublin Castle




Zetland valued the lion (the symbol of England) and it


took up his whole

Ruler






Choose one and draw it large on your largest paper or card






## Here is my work in progress

Lay the pieces on your shield and play around until you are happy with the arrangement








Here is my finished Coat of Arms
