Introduction

We are going on a trip to Ennis Friary
It has beautiful old stone carvings on
display and it is located in the centre of
Ennis town.

In this story we'll learn about how to enter the Friary, meet some of the people who work there and find out what we can expect to see during our visit.

The main entrance to the Friary is on Abbey Street, up the steps through the black gates.

The Information Desk

When we enter the door of the Friary, we will see an information desk.

It might be crowded and noisy and sometimes we will have to wait a while before speaking to a person at the desk.

The person at the desk is there to assist with our visit. They will give us a ticket.

There are friendly and welcoming people in the Friary who can help us.

Tour Guides




When we have questions, we can ask the person at the information desk, or a guide. We can ask them questions about the Friary and they will help us find an answer. If we can't find our family or friends, we should look for a Tour Guide.

Getting Around

The Friary is both indoor and outdoor, there are exit signs to show you how to exit.

To go inside the Friary, go through the big door. The door sometimes squeaks and might makes a loud bang when it shuts. Inside the Friary there is no music or speakers just the sound of people walking and talking



When we go into the Friary where the carvings are, there are a few important things to remember.



We will walk slowly and not run in case we fall and hurt ourselves. Be careful outside as it can be slippy when it is wet. We will not touch the carvings because they can get damaged. Outside the building there is sometimes loud noise and music coming from the pubs on either side and shouting and cheering from the GAA pitch behind us

We can exit the Friary through reception and the same gate we came in
