

# Castletown House, Co. Kildare

Castletown House is Ireland's first and finest Palladian style mansion. Built in the 1720s for William Conolly, Speaker of the Irish House of Commons, Castletown House was constructed to exemplify its owners' influence and immense wealth. In the second half of the eighteenth century, William's grand – nephew Tom and his wife, Lady Louisa, created the grand interiors that visitors can still enjoy today. Remaining in the Conolly family until its sale in 1965, the estate was ultimately acquired by the state in 1994.

# Private Viewing of an Irish Portrait Collection of Miniatures

A "behind the rope", private viewing of an Irish Portrait Collection of Miniatures, on loan from the Irish Georgian Society, in the Lady Kildare Room. The miniature and silhouette were personal items, often given as a gift and, in an age before photography, were often used as a visual memorial of a loved one which could be carried on the person as jewellery.

Your personal expert guide will lead your group on a journey of discovery through Irish history from the turbulent seventeenth century, through the opulence of enlightenment Ireland in the eighteenth century and to the eventual decline of the Big House. Insights into the estate's history, owners (the Conolly family), architectural and decorative art gems.

### Meet the Curator

Once the centre of British rule in Ireland, from 1204 to 1922, Dublin Castle is now the setting for some of the Irish nation's most important state ceremonies.

Ascend the Castle's grand Battleaxe
Staircase and follow in the footsteps of
world-famous figures, from Benjamin
Franklin, Queen Victoria and Charles
Dickens to Nelson Mandela, John F.
Kennedy and Pope Francis. Experience the
beautiful architecture and collections of
this former palace, hear about the making
of modern, independent Ireland, and see
the grand hall where our head of State, the
President of Ireland, is sworn into office.

#### The Dublin Castle Curators

**Dr Myles Campbell** is our Collections Curator and is responsible for researching, displaying, interpreting and supporting the conservation of the Castle's artworks and furnishings. He is passionate about the art and architecture of nineteenth-century Ireland and the lives of the people who shaped it. He holds a PhD in this field from Trinity College Dublin and has taught History of Art and Architecture at university level. His most recent publication, Vicereines of Ireland: Portraits of Forgotten Women, tells the untold stories of the women who once called Dublin Castle home. The book accompanied a landmark exhibition at the Castle in 2021.

William Derham is our Buildings Curator and is responsible for researching, presenting, interpreting and supporting the conservation of the Castle's buildings and interiors. He has a particular interest in the life of the Castle during the twentieth century, from the theft of the Irish Crown Jewels and the last days of the Viceregal Court , through the revolutionary period of 1916–23, to the rehabilitation and use of the Castle in post-independent Ireland. He is a graduate of the Dublin School of Architecture, T.U. Dublin, and studied Building Repair and Conservation at Trinity College Dublin. His most recent publication, Splendour & Scandal, examined the colourful history of the Office of Arms at Dublin Castle.

# Farmleigh House, Dublin

Meet the Librarian and explore the collection of Benjamin Guinness

A historic house holding important collections, an art gallery, a working farm, and the official Irish State guesthouse, Farmleigh House and Estate, located in an estate of seventy-eight acres situated to the north-west of Dublin's Phoenix Park. Farmleigh provides accommodation for visiting dignitaries and guests of the nation, most notably: Queen Elizabeth II is 2011, Emperor of Japan 2005, Prince William and the Duchess of Cambridge, in 2020.

Built by the famous Guinness brewing family, Farmleigh remains a unique representation of its heyday, the Edwardian period, and houses important artworks and furnishings, as well as the Benjamin Iveagh collection of rare books, bindings, and manuscripts, which is held in the Library. The collection is owned by Marsh's Library and the collection was donated to Marsh's Library in 2009 by the Guinness family.

The extensive pleasure grounds feature walled and sunken gardens, and scenic lakeside walks.

### Meet the Librarian and explore the collection of Benjamin Guinness

Enjoy the unique sense of history in the beautiful library of Farmleigh House, once home to the famous Irish brewing family – the Guinnesses.

Soak up the smell of leather and old books while our expert librarian guides you through the world-class collection of rare manuscripts and books. Gain insight into the binding process that created these beautiful books.

The Benjamin Iveagh Library was amassed by Benjamin Guinness (1937-1992), 3rd Earl of Iveagh, a keen and astute collector of rare books, manuscripts and fine bindings. The collection amounts to more than 5,000 items and includes mostly rare Irish books and manuscripts. Among the historical manuscripts in the collection is a 13th century description of Ireland, an Irish-language primer prepared for Queen Elizabeth I. All major Irish writers are represented in the collection, including James Joyce, Seamus Heaney, Samuel Beckett, Jonathan Swift, and includes first editions of Ulysses and Gulliver's Travels.

A particular strength of the collection is in fine Irish bindings from the 18th, 19th and 20th centuries. Together with a large number of 'Livres d'Art' – books with beautiful illustrations by famous artists. This collection is as truly beautiful as it is educational and entertaining.
