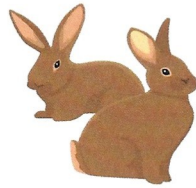
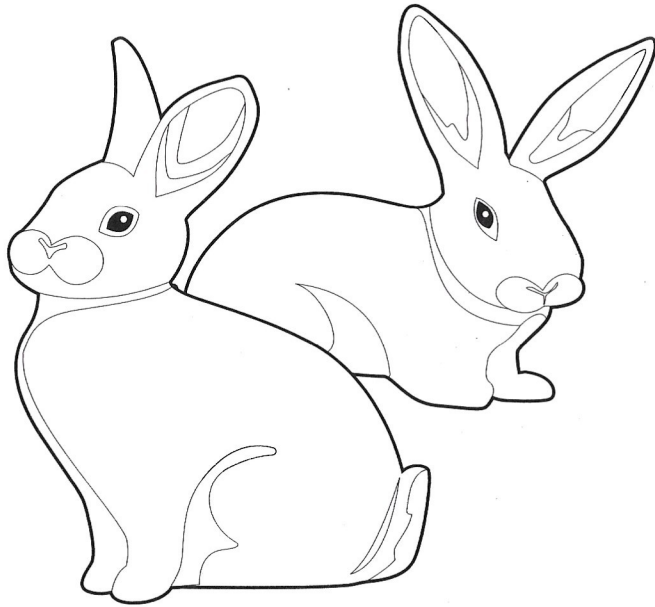

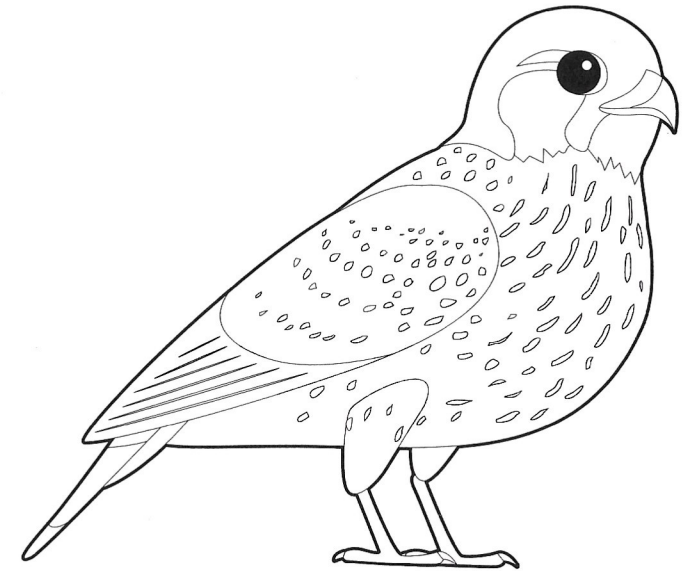
## RABBITS

A male rabbit is called a buck and a female is a doe; a young rabbit is a kitten or kit. Rabbit habitats include meadows, woods, forests, grasslands, deserts and wetlands. Rabbits live in groups and live in underground burrows or rabbit holes. A group of burrows is called a warren. Rabbits appear to be most active at dawn and dusk.



## GREY HERON

The grey feathers and tall stature makes the grey herons unmistakable. They stand very still at the edge of water ready to strike out at their prey with its spear-like bill. It feeds along the edge of a wide range of wetland habitats such as coastal waters, streams and marshy ground. They eat fish, small mammals and insects.



## KESTREL

A small bird of prey with long, narrow wings and tail and a short, hooked bill. They are recognised by their brown back and dark tipped wings. They like the lowlands and open habitats such as fields or marshland and build their nests in rocks or buildings. Kestrels mostly eat small mammals like shrews and mice.
